College Bound?

Checklist of the "stuff" that really counts

□ Book dental and medical exams before departure for your student

- ✓ While there, have your student sign HIPPA release forms to authorize information-sharing with you
- ✓ Have your student complete health care proxies while at the appointments; appointing you as agent

□ Purchase an adequate supply of your student's medications

- ✓ Locate a pharmacy near your student and have prescriptions transferred
- ✓ Keep a list of those medications on you and have your student do so as well

Notify insurance providers of your student's Away-From-Home status

✓ Auto

- ✓ Health
- ✓ Dental

Ensure your student is Insured

- ✓ Be sure your student's possessions are insured at his/her college abode with your homeowner's carrier
- ✓ Add electronics coverage if you don't possess that now
- ✓ Consider obtaining medical evacuation protection insurance if your student will be more than 150 miles from home. Imagine he/she needs an appendectomy You'll want them near you during recovery

□ Verify that your student's bank can conduct business in the school's state

Legal Documents your student should execute

- ✓ Health Care Proxy and Living Will
- ✓ HIPPA forms
- ✓ Power of Attorney naming you as Agent
- ✓ FURPA (Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act) Release form. These are usually found on the school's website. Unless signed, you'll have no access to your student's grades even though YOU may be footing the bill.

Copies of documents and information you should retain on file

- ✓ Legal documents listed above
- ✓ Birth Certificate
- ✓ Passport
- ✓ Driver's License
- ✓ Immunization Record
- ✓ List of medications & dosages
- ✓ Record of your student's car make, model, year and license plate number
- ✓ Student's bank account and credit card numbers
- ✓ Full names, mailing addresses, email addresses, land line & cell numbers of your student's roommate(s), their parents, and the dorm Resident Assistant or apartment landlord.
